The objective there was to illustrate to the Minister that by virtue of Councillor Shepherd's position as the Chairman of the Planning Committee and a position that he has deliberately taken to assert in that role which is considered by me at least to be unusual whereby he ahh is nominating himself or, or presenting himself as the single point of call for all developers, it puts him in a position of potential umm or certainly influence over the outcomes and we have information before us through agenda items whereby Councillor Shepherd has been present at meetings with developers has exerted his influence in terms of what the outcome will be. Officers have taken on board Councillor Shepherd's position on a particular matter. So being the single point of call I'm suggesting to the Minister puts him in a position where he ahh has the potential to umm have a lot of influence over an outcome - a planning matter - prior to the Council itself making any decision or indeed the Committee and the umm ahh that combined with his openly apparently inviting development interests to fund raising functions at this point in time raises questions about or at least there's a perception in the community of some concern about the relationship that might exist between him and developers so I'm not necessarily alleging any wrong doing in my submission to the Minister it's just to indicate to her there is the potential for umm conflict of interest.
