

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY THE KEY TO PROSPERITY

An independent review conducted by the Queensland Treasury Corporation says Redcliffe City Council is in a strong financial position. Mayor Allan Sutherland described the review as "a warts and all procedure" and said it had spurred council on to even greater efforts to bolster its financial position even further.

The graph at the right shows Redcliffe's position as the lowest rating council in south-east Queensland compared with other major local authorities.

"The QTC report said the council's improving financial position since 2003 indicated sound financial management," said Cr Sutherland, who is a candidate for Mayor in the new Moreton Bay Regional Council.

"The council's capacity to significantly fund capital expenditure using operating cash flows was also noted by QTC as a positive indicator," he said.

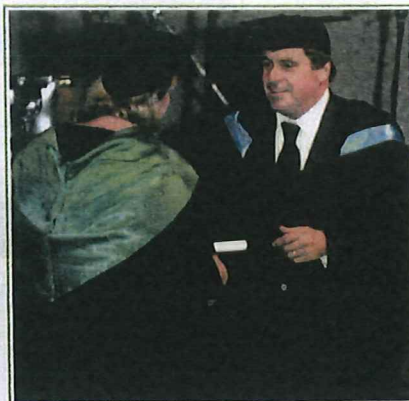
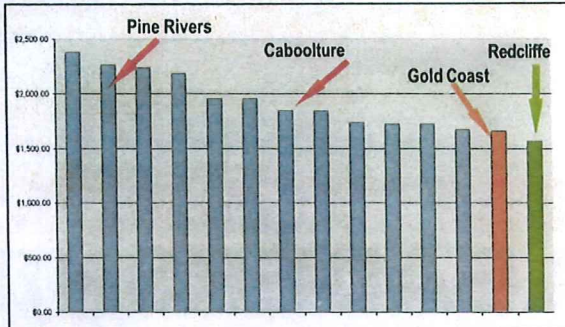
Recently graduating with a Diploma of Business from the Metropolitan South Institute of TAFE, Cr Sutherland is Chair of the Local Transition Committee which has been working through the nuts and bolts arrangements for merging the councils of Pine, Caboolture and Redcliffe. "Overall, achieving a strong rating is great news – it shows the council's financial position is sustainable and well placed to meet the present and future needs of a dynamic community," he said.

"The review assessed council's capacity to meet its financial commitments in the short, medium and long term, rating councils as very strong, strong, moderate, weak, very weak and distressed," Cr Sutherland said.

"The QTC reported that Redcliffe had relatively low debt levels with a good capacity to service new debt if it became needed," he said.

"The review also concluded that there were no known events or circumstances that were likely to have a direct impact on the council's financial sustainability in the immediate future," he said.

Following the report Redcliffe began an internal review of its asset management processes, examined ways to maintain revenue sources, investigated resource sharing and shared service options in a bid to improve its financial status even further.

CABOOLTURE HAS DEBT WORRIES

Less than a year ago the Caboolture Shire Herald reported on Page 1 that the shire debt was set to grow more than tenfold in four years.

The council's Budget documents indicated that debt would rise from \$18.5 million in May last year to \$95.3 million by the end of the 2008 financial year, and \$194.8 million by 2012.

Included in the blowout was a provision of \$18 million for Mayor Joy Leishman's pet Caboolture Central Project, which has raised eyebrows in some quarters.

"Mayor Joy Leishman, who made no mention of the deficit or the extent of debt when announcing the Budget, was unavailable for comment," the paper said.
