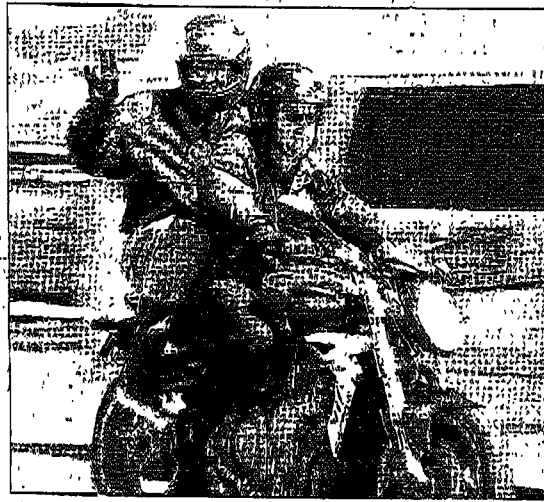

The maximum amount donated to my election campaign from any one source was \$100 for four tickets to my initial fundraising luncheon. I have not received donations from any political parties or business organisations.

I have had some small donations from individuals, under \$50, made by supporters, but my campaign is largely self funded.

DIVISION THREE

Candidate David Childs

I am TOTALLY independent and not a member of any political party, power group or cartel and never have been. I have NOT received ANY DONATIONS from any builder, developer or development company. I am, through family and close friends SELF FUNDED. My campaign has a personal budget of \$15,000 in cash spending which, in part, covers printing costs (letters/cards, four pamphlets, colour photographs, how to vote cards, delivery costs, one radio ad, three local newspapers ads, nomination fee, fuel, phone, to shirts, hats, booth material and postage. Additionally three pairs of shoes, five polo-shirts and two umbrellas have been purchased together with numerous medical items to stop sore feet, flies, midges and repair to one pair of trousers following a dog bite.

An additional 'in kind' donations of approx. \$2000 for the loan of a mobile campaign office has been received. I have returned money and refused financial assistance from three developers and or builders and their companies.

Of the \$15,000 cash outlay, \$1000 has been received from a retired plumber (name available upon request) and a promise of approx. \$500 in total of additional monies has been accepted from close friends.

Candidate Grant Pforr

I have funded my own campaign. I have received great in-kind support from good friends and family, utilising all resources and experience available to me.

My wife has given up her job of almost six years as teacher's aide, to be my campaign manager and general 'Jill of all trades' right down to designing the printed formats. I do strongly believe in candidates declaring all funds and I've written to several businesses and friends to help fund my campaign.

● Raised \$8500 at campaign launch, 140 people attended the evening last November (\$6000 in donations, the balance via a raffle and auction).
