INFORMATION TO ADDRESSEE

GENERALLY

YOU MUST COMPLY WITH THIS NOTICE

Failure to comply with this notice, without reasonable excuse, constitutes an offence which carries a maximum penalty of 85 penalty units or 1 year's imprisonment.

An offence is not committed if the information, document or thing—

is subject to privilege;

OR

is a secret process of manufacture applied by you solely for a lawful purpose.

Privilege, in the context of a misconduct investigation, means -

- (i) legal professional privilege; or
- (ii) public interest immunity; or
- (iii) parliamentary privilege

and includes a claim on the ground of confidentiality. "Confidentiality" means a ground recognised at law that giving an answer, or disclosing a communication or document, would be a breach of an oath taken or statutory or commercial obligation or restriction to maintain secrecy.

By complying with this notice, **YOU DO NOT**—

contravene a provision of an Act or law imposing a statutory or commercial obligation or restriction to maintain secrecy in relation to the information, document, or thing;

OR

incur any civil liability in relation to the information, document or thing.

SHOULD YOU HAVE A CLAIM OF PRIVILEGE

The commission officer is to consider the claim. The commission officer may withdraw the requirement in relation to which the claim is made **OR** may advise you that you may apply to or be required to attend before the Supreme Court to establish the privilege under section 196 of the *Crime and Misconduct Act 2001* (Q).

I refer to the Queensland Crime and Misconduct Commission, Notice To Discover that I have received from Mr Robert Martin Needham on 12th August 2005 requesting a written statement relevant to a misconduct investigation. Please find below my written statement and attached documents as specified in the schedule to this notice.

Details of my election campaign for 2004 were provided after the election as required under the Local Government Act and details are listed below.

My electoral material is attached and this includes my advertising material, receipts and the limited media copy that I kept.

I state that I have known Mr Lionel Barden and his wife Susie for some years and consider them to be friends. As stated in the Gold Coast Bulletin article of March 25th 2004 Mr Barden advised that his only involvement with me for the election was to hand out 'How to Vote Cards'. That is a correct statement of fact.

I had no knowledge or dealings with prior to and including the 2004 election; the Lionel Barden Commonsense Campaign fund; the Lionel Barden Common Sense Trust; the Common Sense Trust; the Lionel Barden Trust; or the Power and Robbins Trust or any other fund.

I had no dealings with Mandra Pty Ltd trading as Quadrant; Hickey Lawyers; Great Southern Land G.M.B.H.; Ray Group Pty Ltd; Gregory Phillips; Sunland Group Limited; Phil Sullivan; Fish Developments Pty Ltd; Devine Ltd; Rapcivic Contractors Pty Ltd; Roche Group Pty Ltd; Villa World Limited; Ingles Group (Qld) Pty Ltd; Blue Sky Capital Pty Ltd or Stockland Development Pty Ltd or any person associated with the aforementioned persons or entities in relation to the Gold Coast City Council elections of 27th March 2004.

I have no personal relationship with Ron Clarke, Brian Rowe, Robert Molhoek or Roxanne Scott. I have a business relationship with Ron Clarke and Robert Molhoek through my work as a Councillor. I do not know Brian Rowe. I have met Roxanne Scott in a business capacity. I have spoken to Roxanne relative to Council matters on the phone and spoken to her personally when I have met her in my course of duties as a Councillor representing the City. I recall having spoken to Roxanne once, shortly after the election by phone. She also some weeks ago called me relative to a Council Agenda Item regarding funding for a project.

I have worked with David Power, Bob La Castra and Ray Hackwood for a number of years as a Councillor and have always maintained a friendly working relationship with them. I have worked with Ted Shepherd prior to my becoming a Councillor and in my role as the Co-

Coordinator of the Tropicarnival Festival and as the organiser of the Tropicarnival Street Parade. Ted was at that time a Council Traffic Officer and in charge of road closures for the parade. I also regard him as a friendly colleague. I met Grant Pforr on several occasions over the years in my capacity as Councillor for Division 11 attending social functions.

Greg Betts contacted me as a resident about two years ago to request my assistance with the provision of a footpath in Varsity Lakes. I regard him as friendly business colleague. I worked with Sue Robbins during her two periods in Council prior to her death and regarded her both as a personal friend and a colleague.

I have not met or have no knowledge of Paul Wesley Brinsmead and my only dealings with Hickey Lawyers have been in the course of my duties as the Divisional Councillor for an area known as 'The Dales' that was developed by Great Southern Land. I dealt with and continue to deal with Great Southern Land when issues arise that are complaints from residents or issues of concern to Council relative to the high maintenance of the lake in the development.

I have had no dealings with Mr Brinsmead or Hickey Lawyers relative to receipt or disbursement of funds by them.

I don't believe that I officially announced that I would run again for Division 11, I simply began my campaign. The earliest advice I can see is in the February Local Newsletter. I nominated for the election on the 12th of February, 2004.

I do not have a campaign committee, campaign manager or anyone who acted for me during the election campaign. My campaign is low cost and run by myself.

I had no bank accounts for the election. I used my personal account ANZ Robina 5311-05485 to deposit the gift from Mr & Mrs McIlwain.



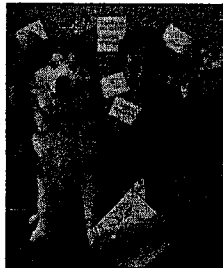
A MESSAGE FROM JAN GREW IMPORTANT - DECLARATION VOTES

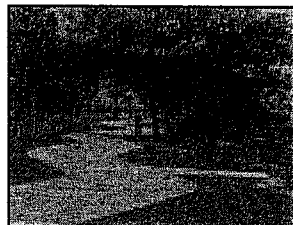


ANZAC DAY 2004

COMMUNITY PLANTING DAY

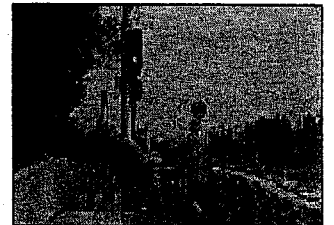

Work has started on the land beside Merrimac Primary School to prepare it for use by the school and the community. Some \$20,000 will be spent initially to improve the site.

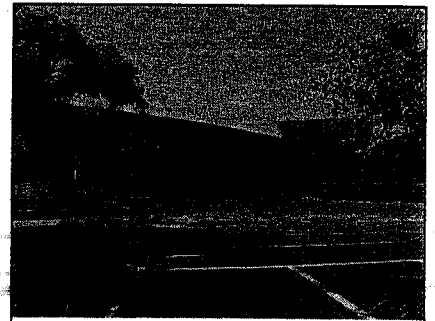

Negotiations are nearing an end for the transfer of Miami Bushland to Council and in the near future Council will be able to preserve the parcel in the best interests of the community.

The Project Reference Group for the Miami CIP are nearing an acceptance of a final Master Plan for the area of the Gold Coast Highway, Toombul Avenue and Kratzman Avenue. I anticipate that construction work will commence in Miami around August/September to revitalise this area.

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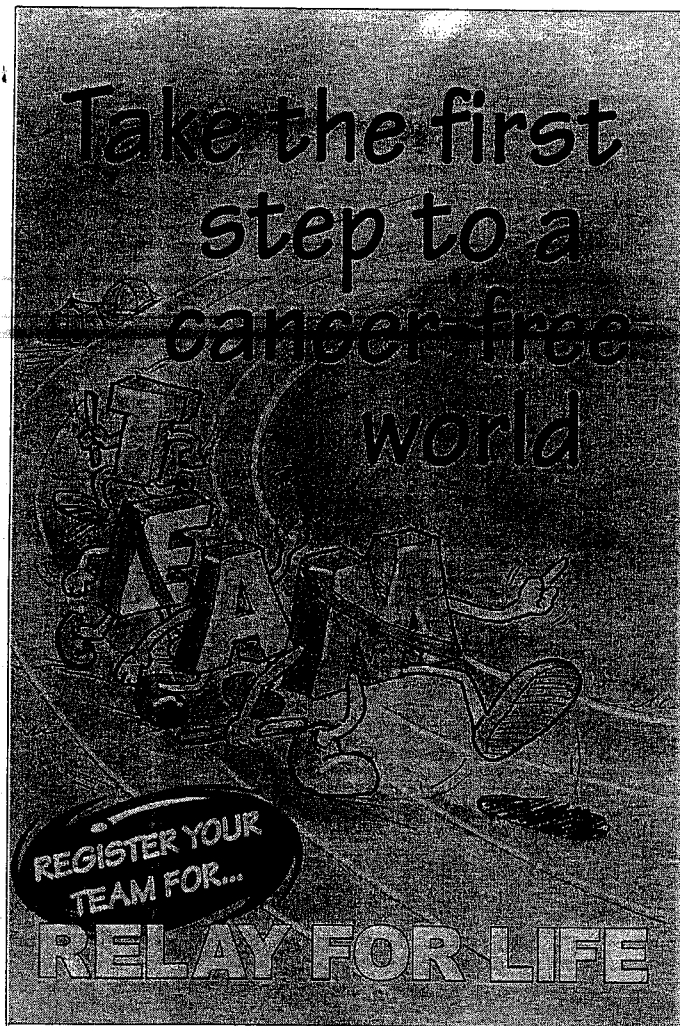
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RELAY FOR LIFE

Relay for Life is an extremely successful community fundraising event now in its 5th year in Australia. The 3rd Gold Coast Relay for Life will take place on 15 & 16 May at the Lake behind the Gold Coast City Council's Evandale Chambers.

Relay for Life is a team event to raise funds for cancer research and services. Teams of 10-15 people compete to keep a team baton moving around the track around the lake over 18 hours (4 pm on Saturday until 10 am on Sunday). At least one team member must be on the track at all times. Teams "camp-out" at the event and entertainment is provided throughout the evening, with breakfast provided for all participants.

Each team sets about raising funds prior to the Relay for Life. A fundraising target of \$1000 is placed on each team to make them eligible for entry into the event. In many instances the teams surpass this target (our state average to date has been \$1770 per team) and some are sponsored by businesses who provide company banners and place signage on team t-shirts.

Teams from companies that have participated in Relay for Life have told us that the experience has been good for staff morale and that their involvement has had a positive effect on workplace relations. Employees have benefited from communicating on a non-work related project. Staff involvement also develops team building, trust and problem solving skills.

We are looking to recruit as many teams as possible from the workforce, and as many Team Captains as possible from within each organisation. Teams can be made up of departments, divisions, branches, social clubs, family and friends. The more teams we are able to recruit, the more money we can raise to fund essential cancer research.

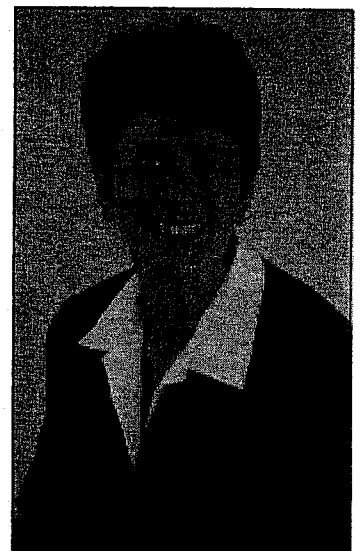

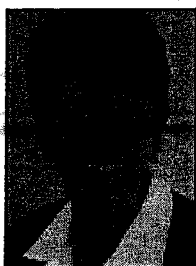

The Council election is now only days away and all residents who are enrolled to vote will need to either attend a polling booth on the day or cast a pre-poll vote at one of the locations in the city which include Mermaid Waters Library, Burleigh Heads Library, Nerang and Surfers Paradise Council administration buildings. Pre-polls are open from 9am to 4.30pm Monday to Friday. On Friday 26th the Pre-polls will stay open until 6pm. If you need any information regarding where to vote please give me a call.

I seek your support to represent the residents of Division 11 for another term and give you my commitment to continue to work honestly and with integrity for the benefit of residents of this wonderful city.

WATER FUTURES

Council has in place plans for the raising of Hinze Dam by 4 metres for flood mitigation purposes. To raise the level of the dam for flood mitigation there must be space for the rainfall to be stored. It is impossible to use the same space behind the dam wall for both flood mitigation and water supply, it must be one or the other. If the space is already full of water (water supply) then water from extreme rain events will flow over the spillway and no flood mitigation will be achieved.



Council has agreed to an extra pipeline from Wivenhoe Dam to supply 85 million litres of water per day by 2007. This will add to the existing smaller pipeline that is already delivering 35 million litres of water from Wivenhoe to the Gold Coast. The pipeline will supply four times the amount of water that would be provided by raising the Hinze Dam wall by 16 metres for about the same cost.

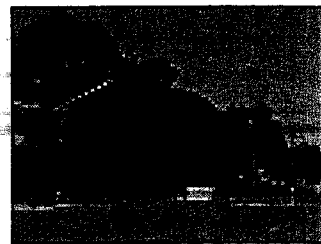
The possible use of desalination and the further raising of the Hinze Dam wall for water supply are two issues that will be further investigated.

ANZAC DAY UPDATE

This year the Anzac Day parade will commence at 8.30am from Arbour Lane in front of Target for a service to commence at 9am in the auditorium at Robina Community Centre. If you are taking part in the parade please meet the Parade Marshall in Arbour Lane prior to 8.30am. Lt Col P.L. Maher will review the parade and the service will follow the parade. If you are attending the service only please be seated in the auditorium prior to 9am. We expect a large crowd for the day so please come along and join us in paying tribute to our brave service men and women.

PARKWAY UPGRADE

Work is nearly complete on the intersection of Robina Parkway and Cheltenham Drive to provide a double right hand turn lane from the Parkway onto Cheltenham Drive heading east. This will alleviate the current long queues for motorists to travel east. Work commenced on March 1st and is expected to take approximately 3 weeks.



LIGHTING CHELTENHAM DRIVE

Funding has been provided to upgrade the lights on Cheltenham Drive between Laver Drive and Woody View Way. This will provide an illuminated link from both Woody View Way, Maximes and La Hacienda developments to the Robina Railway Station. Cost of this upgrade is just over \$20,000.

VOXELLE AT VARSITY

Recently I was asked to unveil Voxelle, a magnificent new art work at Varsity Lakes, by visual artist Barbara Penrose. The magnificent piece is a tall stainless steel structure and fountain that is illuminated at night. Located in Central Park at Varsity Lakes this is another example of the commitment by Delfin Lend Lease to their artwork programme for their development. Carl Bruhn and his team are to be congratulated on their initiative in bringing art to the people.

MIAMI CIP

Preliminary sketches have now been prepared for the Miami Centre Improvement Programme in consultation with the Project Reference Group. The plans include upgrades to Toombul Avenue, Kratzman Avenue and the Gold Coast Highway. Proposals include paving areas, seating nodes, planting areas, new street trees, feature trees and character elements such as a piece of public art, group of seats or other functional pieces of street furniture. The next meeting of the group will take place on March 31st to discuss the Preliminary Master Plan prior to the final draft of the Master Plan. Work is expected to start on construction around August this year.

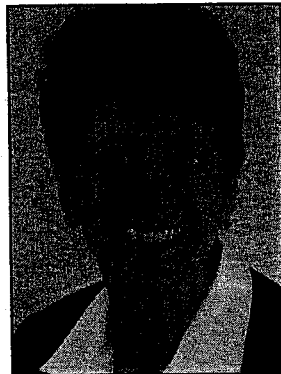

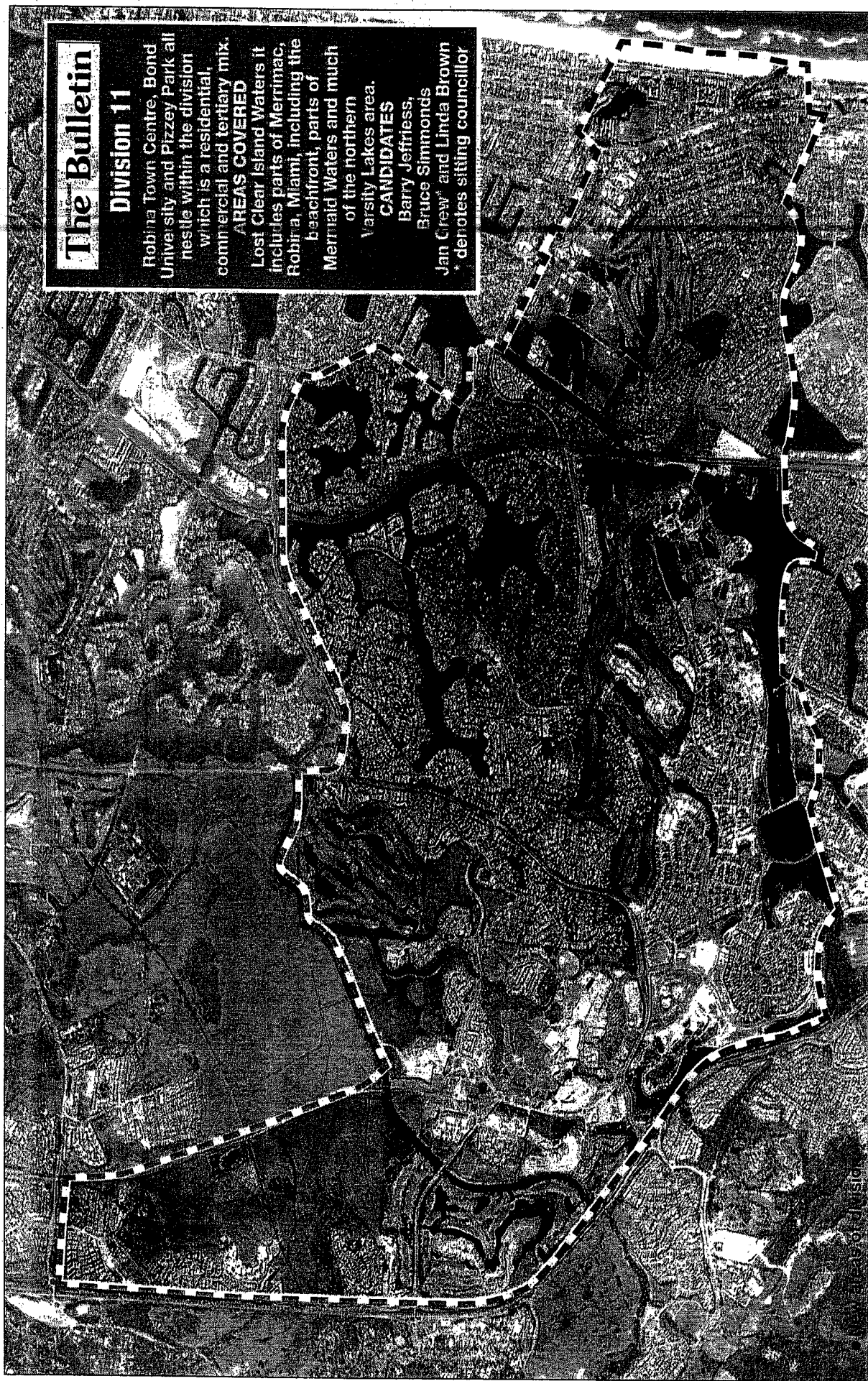

Continuing our series on each of the Gold Coast City Council divisions in the run-up to Saturday's election, **Brian Mossop** reports on Division 11. Based on Robina, voters in this division face the all too familiar concerns of water supply, traffic problems and rate rises.

viewed as the hub of the division, Robina surely is the drive shaft ... at least Robina and Varsity Lakes are the growth areas providing the stimulus, the get up and go, for which the region has long been known.

It also has become known for the commitment of Council for Jan Grew, which has moved very much to the fore in recent times in terms of art, film and community affairs.

"It's a great growth division," says the woman who joined the then Albert Shire Council 10 years ago and has held her place through several elections.

She feels council has done a poor job of conveying the message concerning the measures taken to secure the Gold Coast's water supply and ensure adequate flood mitigation is in place.

Whatever her assurances on the water question, they are not taken seriously by Barry Jeffries who, along with personal injury lawyer Bruce Simmonds and Linda Brown, is opposing Cr Grew.

In the four-way tussle just two - Cr Grew and Barry Jeffries - have had council experience; Jan with the Gold Coast City Council and Barry from 1995-99 as a councillor in the NSW country city of Orange. Working in senior positions from 1957, Mr Jeffries in 1993 was head-hunted to join the electricity industry with a view to preparing it for corporatisation and was later appointed to a committee to negotiate performance agreements.

He was then appointed to the NSW Government Corporatisation Committee which planned the corporatisation of the electricity industry in NSW before being appointed the first CEO of what then was known as Advance Energy covering all amalgamated distributors in the central west.

Having moved to the Coast initially in 1997 and committed forthrightly to council meetings

here in 1999 and decided to run for council 'out of frustration'.

"When you know the industry you get really frustrated when you see what is going on," he says. "I don't really need it, I have a very successful consulting business. But how much do you take? If you see what's going on around you, you feel compelled to do something."

What he sees as council's inability to make a decision is what spurred him to run for Division 9.

"They're unable to make a decision," he says.

"They've made possibly three or four major decisions four weeks out from the election; they weren't able to make them in the past four years, and that's a real worry."

"It's very easy for councils to make decisions and then rescind them after they're elected. I use as an instance the raising of the dam wall. Really, there is no commitment among the councillors to raise the Hinze Dam wall.

"It's only community pres-

tee, the floodplain committee chaired by (retired) Judge Hanger, that has prompted them to make a decision. Now if there is no commitment or ownership it is very easy to rescind that decision once you're re-elected."

"The council's total thrust seems to be on the Wivenhoe solution and that's not only costly but may have limited tenure. The Mayor of Brisbane has already come out and said 'it's our water', but I understand council is going to be paying 95c a kilolitre for it which makes it pretty expensive water which they are then going to have to on-sell to the consumers and recover the cost of building the mains and servicing any loans."

Rating also is something dear to Barry's heart.

"I developed a system in NSW which was adopted by the Department of Local Government which solves this problem of fluctuations in valuations," he says. "But I haven't been able to get to first base.

"I joined the Concerned

they were very interested in what I was saying.

"However, Linda Brown has gone off on another tangent with the council and they look like adopting the Maroochy-dore model which is untested.

"My problem with it is it will result in increases for the people who can least afford it. That's the minimum general ratepayers and all unit holders on the Gold Coast of which there are many."

Water, rates and flood mitigation are among his major concerns. Jan Grew is confident both water and flood mitigation already have been addressed.

The growth within the division - from which Clear Island Waters and half of Merrimac have been excised - means an expanding need for social services, community facilities, over, and above what already has been achieved.

A community centre in Robina and a library - needs extending - are just two of the major additions to cultural

provide smaller meeting rooms to satisfy community needs.

She also hopes to convince council to include a sub-office in Robina which could handle matters such as payment of rates.

Cr Grew is disappointed the State Government has not yet handed over the Miami bushland, as it agreed to do, and will pressure for that to happen.

Pizzey Park is one of the division's gems and, on the question of rates and rate increases, she says council already has in place an arrangement whereby rates can be deferred if paying them on increased UCV assessments becomes a burden.

As for issues such as water and flood, Cr Grew says all people really want to know is 'will there be enough water?' and 'if there's a flood what will happen?'

"I think we could have answered those questions in a much more simplified way," she says. "We just haven't explained it well enough."

at council as natural because many of the issues cross local, State and Federal boundaries.

"A lot of problems are either Federal or local issues," he says. "I want to do something, serve somewhere."

His ideas include assistance to doctors to provide bulk billing services, to dentists, to security companies, to help attract them to set up here.

"We have to do something at a local level," he says.

"Make an offer to doctors, physios, dentists, security companies, any industry, say come here and we'll give you rate relief as start-up assistance."

"We will contribute to overheads and at the end of the day the community benefits Water, traffic, development planning needs to be put in place now, better planning Local problems need local solutions. As for rating, rate spikes should be removed."

Rates is a major issue, if not the only issue, for Linda Brown.

"My commitment is to adopt the Community Consultation Rating Report and make sure it is implemented before the next rates notices are issued," she says. "This will bring in a faster rating system for all residents."

A founding member of the Concerned Ratepayers Association, which now boasts 400 members, Linda is one of eight CRA candidates running in various divisions with high hopes that several will win seats and be able to force a rate freeze.

"The UCVs have been held back by the State Government and the chances are there will be large rises," Linda says. "We are hopeful of having the numbers to freeze rates this year."

"Traffic is a huge problem and light rail is not the answer," she says, noting also that the city cannot afford to waste time and resources or procrastinate any longer over the major issues.

Power (Division 2), Jan Grew (Division 11), Bob La Castra (Division 8), Ted Shepherd (Division 9) and Sue Robbins (Division 14), and challengers Grant Pforr (Division 3), Brian Rowe (Division 5), Rob Molhoek (Division 4) and Roxanne Scott (Division 6).

It is understood candidates backed by Mr Ray have access to a trust fund being administered by a Gold Coast law firm.

Mr Ray said the idea was to overcome the dysfunctional, illogical decisions made by a council more concerned with personalities than issues.

"My interest was to see if there could be a more compatible group that can work together," said Mr Ray.

"I don't know which candidates have got it. I provided some small amount of money to a concept.

"The concept is to try to get a more rational approach to the membership of council so they act in a more appropriate manner.

"I have contributed. I'm not going to give you that (the amount), not a significant amount of money.

"All those things become transparent (after the election)... yes, after you have all made your decisions."

Mr Ray said former Robina Chamber of Commerce president Lionel Barden approached him about the campaign, a claim Mr Barden yesterday denied.

Mr Barden, the managing director of the Innovation Showcase at Gold Coast Airport, said he had

not spoken to Mr Ray for about four years.

He said his only involvement in Saturday's election was to hand out how-to-vote cards for councillors Jan Grew and Ted Shepherd.

"I promise on my heart, cross my heart, I have not. I'm telling you the truth," said Mr Barden.

"I haven't had a conversation with Brian. I have been supportive of people like Ted Shepherd and Jan Grew because they have helped me.

"I have heard there are people, who have put money up."

But Mr Ray was adamant that Mr Barden was behind the funding drive.

"Lionel Barden was, as I understood it, the face of the campaign. I'm surprised he's told you that," said Mr Ray. "I wish them well. I hope that's the outcome. I think that will make for a better result for the city."

Mr Ray said he was approached 'months and months' ago and was one of the first to contribute.

Mr Abedian said he was approached by Mr Ray to make a donation, which he did.

Green preferences for Gary

THE Greens will give their preferences to Mayor Gary Baildon because he can keep the other councillors in line, says mayoral candidate Ian Latto.

He also said fellow candidates Ron Clarke and Elvis impersonator Dean Vegas were loose cannons and not suitable for the top job.

"For leadership qualities, Gary Baildon seems to be able to persuade the councillors to settle down and work with a larger vision in mind despite their differences," he said.

"After weighing up the options, the Greens have decided he is our best choice to give preferences to."

He would not say how much money he had contributed, but said it was not significant.

"Yes, I have been approached. I was supportive of the attitude that they wanted to have a more common view about the decision," said Mr Abedian, who has in the past donated generously to Mayor Baildon and other councillors.

"Brian Ray said a fund has been established to have more sensible approach to the council decisions for the betterment of the city.

"Anything that can bring a common vision to the council, we're happy. Brian told me that it is a good cause to do and (I said) okay I do it.

"I don't even know who the recipients of it are. It was purely a vision."

Veteran councillor David Power, who chairs the city's planning and development (north) committee, yesterday continued to deny involvement in the 'ticket'.

He admitted to having met with Mr Ray prior to Christmas to discuss who on the council was easy to work with.

"I have told you guys over and over again. I have been asked for advice by candidates, by business people and I have given the advice," said Cr Power, who says he is 'good mates' with Mr Barden.

"What they have done from there is their own business.

"I can't remember the last time I spoke to Brian. I'm serious, I think it was before Christmas. He asked me about my opinion about how council was functioning.

"My opinion was it's not functioning properly. "There were too many people pursuing personal agendas.

"He asked who I have been able to work with and who has been difficult to work with."

When asked whether the 'difficult' councillors he named included Dawn Crichtlow and Peter Young, who are both being challenged by big-money campaigners, he said: "I gave him my honest opinions... you can assume all you like, that's a private conversation.

"I have no idea what he (Brian Ray) was planning to do... I have

Mr Rowe was, however, aware that a trust fund was available to be used by certain candidates but said he did not know the source of those funds.

He said it would not have surprised him to discover that money had been contributed by developers.

"I have money from a trust fund but I'm unsure who's made contributions to any of that," said Mr Rowe.

"That's one of the things I presume John was talking about. He said he can't release names because he has to go back to them and ask if they mind, because of the privacy laws. I have had enough trouble being a candidate, let alone worrying about funding.

"At the time I was considering that (running for council) I knew that we were going to need a budget... you don't go in with two and six. I was aware of the fact that there were monies available if I was prepared to run as a candidate.

"The intricacies of where that money was coming from, I'm unaware. Other money has come from family and friends."

Premier Peter Beattie said the Gold Coast City Council would benefit from having a caucus.

"The Gold Coast is the state's second city and it would benefit from more cohesion and more support for the mayor, to be perfectly frank. But I wouldn't want to see one particular person get projects up because of it."

PROPERTY developer Brian Ray has admitted that he and other businessmen are behind the big budget campaigns of a group of council candidates planning to form a voting bloc on the Gold Coast City Council.

Neither would say how much money they had given or which candidates were involved.

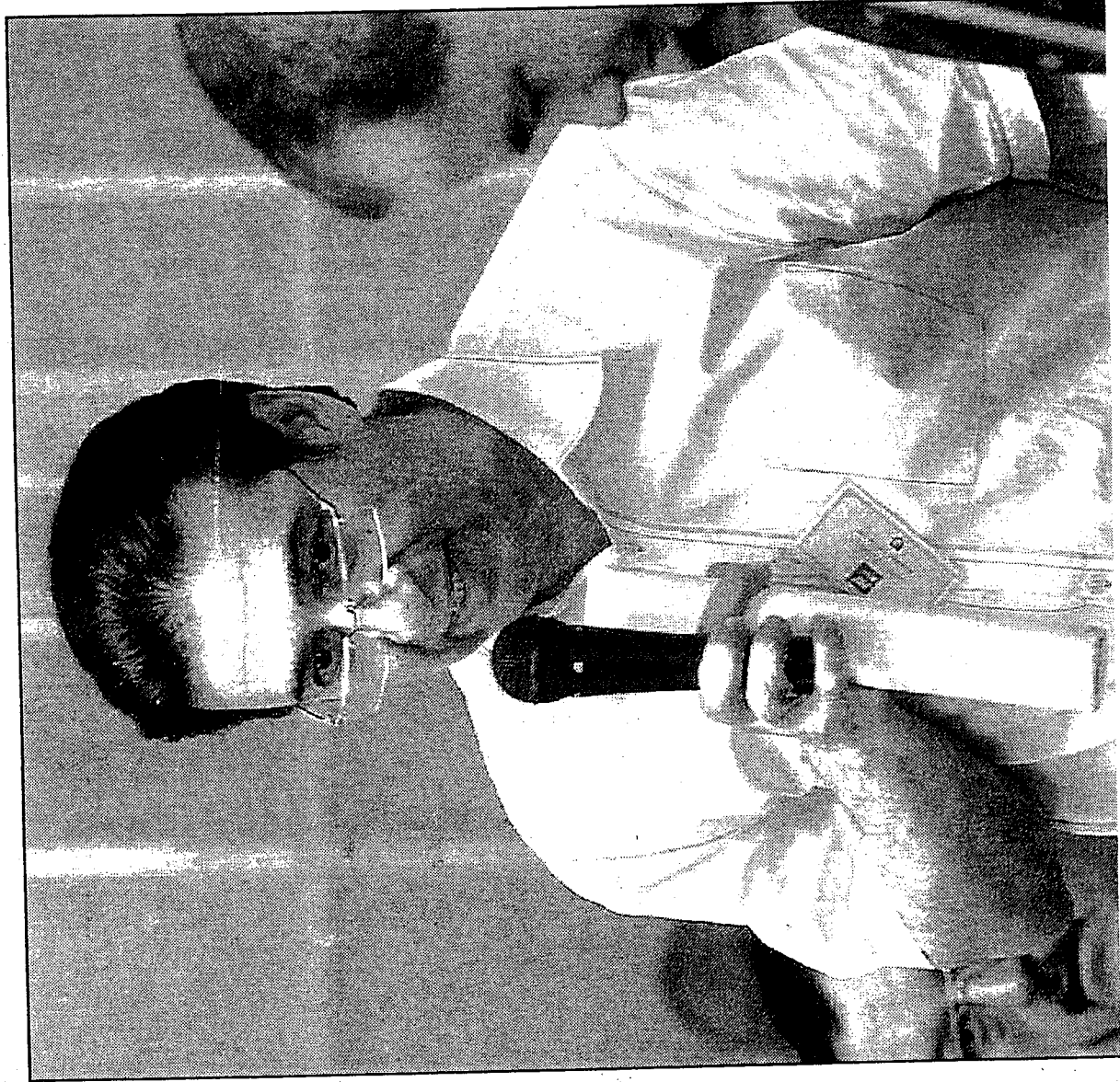

'Council will not survive 100 days'

THE new Gold Coast City Council will not survive its first 100 days without intervention by an administrator.

That's the dire prediction of maverick councillors Eddy Sarroff and Dawn Crichlow who claim the council is not acting with the best interests of residents at heart.

They say a voting bloc of so-called 'like-minded' councillors has hijacked the council agenda.

Animosity and tensions between the councillors were obvious during yesterday's first meeting of the co-ordination committee, which has all 15 councillors on its membership.

Throughout the two-hour meeting there was much eye-rolling, note-passing, snickering and whispered comments shared by many of the councillors.

When councillors rumoured to make up the voting bloc voted together on a planning matter, Cr Crichlow called out: "That's the bloc."

Cr Robbins accused Crs Crichlow and Sarroff of having taken money from developers.

Finally Cr Jan Grew stood and demanded that Mayor Ron Clarke order Cr Sarroff to apologise for a comment she heard him make.

"I understood the new council was going to be very conscious about conduct and Cr Sarroff has just insulted me quite inappropriately, I would ask him to apologise," she said.

Cr Sarroff said: "This is a waste of time, it's been happening left, right and centre, I don't have anything to say."

Cr Grew said: "I believe when another councillor says to me, 'At least I make sense' that is a direct insult and I request an apology. Cr Crichlow has just said 'It's the truth'. This is not appropriate.

"If we are to go into this new four-year term as a dignified council this sort of play-acting, shenanigans and rudeness has got to stop.

"It's not adult, not grown up and it's quite wrong. I ask for an apology from both of them."

Cr Sarroff made a vague sort of apology but Cr Crichlow said she had nothing to apologise for.

The actions of the council are being watched closely by both the Crime and Misconduct Commission and the Local Government Minister Desley Boyle, following complaints by councillors and the public.

A CMC spokesman said a complaint lodged by Cr Dawn Crichlow was being assessed to decide whether it fell within the CMC's jurisdiction.

Cr Sarroff said he wanted to give the ministers and the CMC time to investigate but felt that until councillors put aside personal differences the council would not operate effectively.

"If councillor's loyalties are going to be to each other rather than the community then we shouldn't last 100 days," he said.

Cr Crichlow agreed.

"The bloc has taken control. I think they will appoint an administrator," she said.

"So many people have sent e-mails, written submissions to the Minister, she must step in.

"I have no problem with a few insults. We used to have a lot of fun but now it's personal. It's not working, it's out of control."

Mayor Ron Clarke said the council had nothing to fear and he was confident that once a new Code of Conduct 'with teeth' was introduced there would be no more problems.

"There's no reason why the council shouldn't last," he said.

Final Return

All candidates must submit to the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the relevant local government, within three months after the conclusion of the election, a final return of gifts received in the approved return. The return can be given or posted to the CEO at the address of the local government's public office.

Nomination deposits (\$150) will be refunded at the conclusion of the expiration of the 30 day disclosure period following the declaration of the election and upon receipt of the final return of election gifts required under the Act.

Final or Interim Return

Prior to making the declaration of office as a Mayor/Councillor, all successful candidates must submit a return of elections gifts to the CEO. The return can be a FINAL RETURN or an INTERIM RETURN.

Interim return - may be submitted to the CEO if the successful candidate does not have all the information regarding gifts readily available prior to taking the declaration of office. The successful candidate would however, need to ensure that a final return was submitted within the three month period after the conclusion of the election.

NB. If gifts are received as an individual candidate (including the individual's campaign committee), or as a member of a group of candidates (including the group's campaign committee), the successful candidate must complete both Sections B and C of Local Government Election Gifts Form 1.

Other relevant information

Amending a Return

Section 432 of the Act allows a person who has submitted a final return to apply to the CEO at any time to correct an error or omission in the return.

Required Information

A person who suspects or believes that a final return has an error or omission may inform the CEO of their suspicion or belief. The candidate making the return will then be advised and must, within 30 days, establish if the return needs to be amended and apply to do so in accordance with Section 432 of the Act.

If a candidate is unable to supply all information to complete a final return, the candidate must state in the certification of their return, where and why the return is deficient and who may be able to supply the missing particulars.

Information relevant to such a return that comes to the attention of the candidate within five years after the conclusion of the election must also be given to the CEO in accordance with Section 438 of the Act.

Inspection

Section 434 of the Act provides that all final returns will be kept in a Register of Electoral Gifts which is open to inspection by any person.

Important Note

Substantial penalties apply for failure to lodge a return or if the contents are false or misleading.
