INFORMATION TO ADDRESSEE

GENERALLY

YOU MUST COMPLY WITH THIS NOTICE

Failure to comply with this notice, without reasonable excuse, constitutes an offence which carries a maximum penalty of 85 penalty units or 1 year's imprisonment.

An offence is not committed if the information, document or thing—

is subject to privilege;

OR

is a secret process of manufacture applied by you solely for a lawful purpose.

Privilege, in the context of a misconduct investigation, means -

- (i) legal professional privilege; or
- (ii) public interest immunity; or
- (iii) parliamentary privilege

and includes a claim on the ground of confidentiality. "Confidentiality" means a ground recognised at law that giving an answer, or disclosing a communication or document, would be a breach of an oath taken or statutory or commercial obligation or restriction to maintain secrecy.

By complying with this notice, **YOU DO NOT**—

contravene a provision of an Act or law imposing a statutory or commercial obligation or restriction to maintain secrecy in relation to the information, document, or thing;

OR

incur any civil liability in relation to the information, document or thing.

SHOULD YOU HAVE A CLAIM OF PRIVILEGE

The commission officer is to consider the claim. The commission officer may withdraw the requirement in relation to which the claim is made OR may advise you that you may apply to or be required to attend before the Supreme Court to establish the privilege under section 196 of the *Crime and Misconduct Act 2001 (Q)*.

IF

a claim is made in relation to a document or thing you are required to give or produce to the commission;

AND

the document or thing is in your possession or you acknowledge the document or thing is in your possession;

AND

the commission officer does not withdraw the requirement;

THE COMMISSION OFFICER MUST REQUIRE YOU TO IMMEDIATELY SEAL THE DOCUMENT OR THING [the "SEALED EVIDENCE"] AND GIVE IT TO THE COMMISSION OFFICER FOR SAFE KEEPING.

If an application is made to a Supreme Court, the Registrar is to dispose of the sealed evidence in the way ordered by the judge.

If an application is not made by the end of 3 court days after the day on which the document or thing is given to the Registrar, the Registrar is to return the sealed evidence to you.

If you and the commission representative give the registrar notice that an agreement on the disposal of the sealed evidence has been reached, the Registrar is to dispose of the sealed evidence in the way agreed.

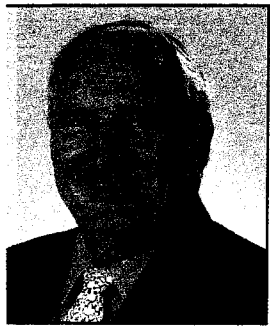



Schedule of Documentation - Items 1 & 2.

Item 1.

'All Documentation relating to details of Gifts, donations, services, benefits or funds received for use at 27 March 2004 elections'.

As a preamble, you will note that my Campaign Treasurer has maintained a formal income and expenditure balance sheet for the election campaign leading up to the 2004 elections. It details all monies received and all election expenses. The 'election office' was located at my home at 15 Baileys Road Mudgeeraba, with all campaign meetings and administration conducted on the premises. All financial transactions were conducted through an individual account at the Bank of Queensland, titled 'Ted Shepherd Campaign Account' which carries associated deposit books and cheque books. The Account Number is [REDACTED]. All of these records balance and are available for inspection.

Item 2.

'All files, documents, records, records of meetings, advertisements, general records and promotion material'.

Dot Point 1.

Relating to my candidacy and to my election campaign, please find the attached documents, which are my complete record of a successful election campaign. Considerable funds were utilised to provide a highly professional campaign to counteract a concerted effort by the 'green movement' to prevent my re-election. Evidence shows that my opponents, Jill Pead and Guy Jones, had combined their efforts to defeat me. Their how-to-vote cards were joined and they collaborated with existing Councillors to discredit me and create public mistrust.

The following details my records of the 2004 election campaign contained in addendum 'B':

Dot Point 2.

Relating to the 2004 elections; regarding all matters, correspondence, campaign strategies or planning of any nature, campaign promotions or meetings:

- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Lionel Barden, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with the Lionel Barden Common Sense Trust, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with the Common Sense Trust, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with the Lionel Barden Trust, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with the Power and Robbins Trust, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Hickey Lawyers, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Great Southern Land GMBH, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Ray Group Pty Ltd, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Gregory Phillips, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Sunland Group Limited, other than through ticket sales to the fund raising held on 12th November, 2003, however no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Phil Sullivan, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Fish Development Pty Ltd, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Devine Ltd, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Rapcivic Contractors Pty Ltd, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Roche Group Pty Ltd, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Villa World Limited, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Ingles Group (Qld) Pty Ltd, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Blue Sky Capital Pty Ltd, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.
- I have had no dealings nor campaign meetings with Stockland Development Pty Ltd, what-so-ever, and therefore no documentation is available.

With regard to Mandra Pty Ltd trading as Quadrant, I can advise that I utilised this marketing and advertising firm for promotional activities. They fully produced my 'Well Done Ted' leaflet including photography, script and print production. This production was fully paid at commercial rates; no favours, discounts or in-kind services were provided. All invoices and records for this work are contained in addendum 'A'. Mr Chris Morgan, who is a partner at Quadrant and a long time friend, served on my campaign committee as marketing advisor in an honorary position.

Dot Point 3.

All files, documents, notes and correspondence that may indicate the nature and extent of association between myself and my fellow Councillors, and prospective candidates.

With regard to existing Councillors at the time of the election; Power, Hackwood, La Castra, Grew, Robbins, I can say that I considered these Councillors to be of high integrity and am proud to call them 'friends'. We met infrequently socially, yet my wife and I enjoyed their company. I was never influenced to vote on any issue against my will and maintained a high standard of professionalism when dealing on all Council matters. I have no documentation that would indicate anything but a sound working relationship with these people that is totally independent in practice but is like-minded in nature.

With regard to Ron Clarke, except for a short meeting in my office at Council on 14th October 2003, to introduce himself, I had no dealings or contact what-so-ever.

With regard to Grant Pforr, Brian Rowe, Robert Molhoek, Roxanne Scott and Greg Betts, I can say that I was invited to attend a meeting at the offices of Quadrant during October 2003, where I was asked to attend to brief prospective candidates on how I ran my campaigns and what were my impressions of the role of a Councillor.

I attended one meeting only but unfortunately have no documentation that would indicate when this meeting was held. I am uncertain whether Roxanne Scott was in attendance or not as it was the first occasion that I had met these people and they attended at various times. I had no further contact with these people throughout the balance of their election campaigns. Given my association with Chris Morgan, I advised him personally and deliberately, that I would have no input into other candidates election campaigns, that I would not be involved in any joint campaign funding or the release of joint election material. This concern is supported by the emails I have enclosed as addendum C1 and C2.

Statement of Information - Item 3.

I, Edward Lloyd Shepherd, a Councillor of the City of Gold Coast hereby make the following statements in regard to my dealings with external individuals, entities and financial institutions associated with my re-election to Council at the Local Government elections held on 27th March, 2004. This information is supplied to the best of my recollection.

With regard to your request for information dealing with the following:

Dot Point 1.

I have no hesitation in providing my records, which clearly show all monies, services, and in-kind support, which was utilised in my re-election campaign for office at the 2004 elections. This campaign balance sheet was maintained by my campaign treasurer, Ms Nicola Russ, who accepted the sole responsibility of receiving all campaign donations, recording those donations correctly and distributing funds appropriately for the payment of goods and services. No other campaign committee member was aware of the funding sources and all campaign donations have been recorded and listed in my election disclosure in accordance with the Local Government Act. A balance sheet was maintained and was reconciled against regular bank statements, which are all presented for scrutiny by the Commissioners.

Although listed elsewhere, campaign donations were received from the following:

- Maxivista Pty Ltd (Mudgeeraba Markets Shopping Centre)	\$5000
- Gibbs Truck Parts (Chris Gibbs, personal friend)	\$250
- Ray King (Personal friend)	\$200
- A M Rudd (Agnes Rudd, mother-in-law)	\$15000
- W Laver (Personal friend)	\$1000
- AHC (Development Company)	\$1000
- WK Group (L Walter - arrived anonymously - identity unknown)	\$500
- Pacific Equity (Qld) Pty Ltd (Development Company)	\$1000
- O P Yong Gee (Owen Yong Gee, business associate)	\$1500
- W Millican (Personal friend and Solicitor)	\$1000

Other campaign funds were received through a wine tasting function held prior to the election where written invitations were issued, all tickets were presold and appropriate value received. The function was held at the Woodchoppers Inn, Mudgeeraba on 12th November 2003, with wines supplied by Lindrums Wines, food by the Woodchoppers Inn and entertainment by comedian Danny McMaster. All costs to us were at commercial rates based on promotional benefits and counter sales.

This function was not listed on my 2004 election return as I was advised that the Local Government Act does not require the disclosure of funds obtained from a fund-raising function.

Dot Points 2, 3 and 4.


As can be seen on the campaign spreadsheet, all gifts have been recorded and services paid for; no in-kind work was performed other than by the assistance of performers and the wine company at the above Fundraising function.

The wine company from South Australia (Lindrums) provided the wines and a consultant to talk on the wines at a reduced rate of a 50/50 cost share basis. This was done because the agent was able to take further orders for the wines and considered this function as a promotion for the Gold Coast market. This is a standard commercial arrangement for wine tastings.

Mr McMaster performed free of charge but only for 30 minutes as can be seen from the evening running sheet (Addendum D1). I have known the McMaster family for many years so it was understandable that Danny wanted to support my campaign. He was able to raise funds on the evening by the sale of T-shirts and CDs. I am unable to put a reliable value on his services for that function. The Woodchoppers Inn proprietor charged commercial rates for the savouries provided.

Apart from the above function all other services, equipment and literature used during the election campaign was fully funded and accounted for.

Statement of Information - Item 4.

I, Edward Lloyd Shepherd, a Councillor of the City of Gold Coast hereby make the following statements in regard to my dealings with external individuals, entities and financial institutions associated with my re-election to Council at the Local Government elections held on 27th March, 2004. This information is supplied to the best of my recollection.

With regard to your request for information dealing with the following:

Dot Point 1.

Regarding Mr Lionel Barden, my wife and I have met Mr Barden and his wife on several occasions at Council related functions and socially at private functions perhaps twice. We have never met to discuss campaign issues relating to myself or any other candidate. We have never discussed the establishment of a financial trust to assist candidates nor did I participate in the creation of a trust or receive any funding from a trust.

With reference to the Fund Identities, Companies, individuals and trusts mentioned in dot point one, other than 'Quadrant', I have had no dealings to encourage or receive financial assistance for my re-election in 2004; I have had no dealings to assist any other candidate for election in 2004; I have had no dealings to create a voting bloc of Councillors nor to be influenced by the Companies or Individuals identified in this list who are involved in the Development Industry.

With reference to dealings with Mandra Pty Ltd trading as Quadrant, I can declare that I utilised this professional Marketing and Advertising agency to produce a leaflet for distribution during the election campaign. The leaflet was titled 'Well Done Ted' and sought to highlight the achievements of my prior term in office. It was extremely professional in its production and this attracted criticism from my opponents that I was spending too much money on my campaign. Quadrant undertook full production of this leaflet including photography, script, layout and printing. This work was fully costed and quoted at commercial rates. The total amount was paid and no favours, discounts or in-kind services were supplied. All costs associated with this work were paid from campaign funds.

Additionally, I have a personal relationship with Mr Chris Morgan who is a partner in Quadrant. Mr Morgan is a personal friend whom I have known for many years as a fellow Rotarian and then partner and fiancé to Ms Nicola Russ who has been a member of my Campaign Committee for over ten years. Mr Morgan attended many of my campaign meetings to advise on marketing initiatives however, due to his involvement with Quadrant, it was made clear to Mr Morgan that other candidates and election campaigns were not to utilise our campaign strategies and that we wanted no contact or association with their campaigns. (refer Addendum C1 and C2) This arrangement was well scrutinised by my Campaign Committee and no interaction occurred. Mr Morgan had no dealings what-so-ever with campaign funding either through the collection of funds or its disbursement.

Dot Point 2.

With regard to the nature and extent of association between myself and my fellow Councillors, both listed and unlisted, I can declare that I have a close professional relationship with them all. I am not tied to nor influenced by any commitments to a 'voting bloc', and maintain at all times my individuality to determine issues according to my own knowledge or the assessment of information placed before Council. I treat all Councillors as equals. I never begrudge Councillors their opinions and have never waged a vendetta against any Councillor, but, I will always defend my integrity and hold in high regard my good name and reputation.

There are some Councillors with whom I maintain a close relationship and with whom I confide my concerns and seek their opinion and conversely there are other Councillors whom I mistrust politically; but I repeat, this does not influence my individual determination of Council matters.

With regard to existing Councillors at the time of the election; Power, Hackwood, La Castra, Grew, Robbins, I can say that I considered these Councillors to be of high integrity and am proud to call them 'friends'. We met infrequently socially, yet my wife and I enjoyed their company. I was never influenced to vote on any issue against my will and maintained a high standard of professionalism when dealing on all Council Matters. I have no documentation that would indicate anything but a sound working relationship with these people that is totally independent in practice but is like-minded in nature.

With regard to Ron Clarke, except for a short meeting in my office at Council on 14th October 2003, to introduce himself, I had no dealings or contact what-so-ever.

With regard to Grant Pforr, Brian Rowe, Robert Molhoek, Roxanne Scott and Greg Betts, I can say that I was invited to attend a meeting at the offices of Quadrant during October 2003, where I was asked to attend to brief prospective candidates on how I ran my campaigns and what were my impressions of the role of a Councillor.

I attended one meeting only but unfortunately have no documentation that would indicate when this meeting was held. I am uncertain whether Roxanne Scott was in attendance or not as it was the first occasion that I had met these people and they attended at various times. I had no further contact with these people throughout the balance of their election campaigns. Given my association with Chris Morgan, I advised him personally and deliberately, that I would have no input into other candidates election campaigns, that I would not be involved in any joint campaign funding or the release of joint election material. This concern is supported by the emails I have enclosed as addendum C1 and C2.

Other Candidates for the elections from other Divisions and the Mayoralty also asked for my guidance in running for Council and I gave general advice as did most sitting Councillors. I had no connections to any other campaign in regard to formal strategies or funding and deliberately made it so. I am aware that Councillors Young, Sarroff and Crichlow were involved in guiding other candidates against sitting Councillors or intervening in matters in Divisions other than their own; but am not prepared to formally object to this activity. That is their business.

Dot Point 3.

I can declare that I have had no dealings what-so-ever with Paul Wesley Brinsmead and/or Hickey Lawyers in relation to the receipt or disbursement of campaign funds in respect of the 2004 Council Elections either for myself or any other candidate.

Dot Point 4.

I was one of the first to announce my candidacy for the 2004 elections via an article in the Gold Coast Bulletin well before the official call for nominations. As a sitting Councillor I was under considerable media attention caused by extremist green groups who opposed the construction of streetscaping works in Mudgeeraba. This necessitated my public announcement early but I am unable to find a record that shows the date of publication of this article.

Dot Point 5.

My records show the date of my nomination to be 16th February, 2004.

Dot Point 6.

The following are individuals who assist me with my election campaigns and who are all close personal friends. They do this work voluntarily and receive no remuneration for their services.

All campaign funds are kept in a Bank of Queensland Account, numbered 90 221517 and titled 'Ted Shepherd Campaign Account'.

Monies were receipted into this account via a Deposit Book and all outgoings were paid via cheques. All of these transactions were balanced to the bank statements and my campaign treasurer is tasked with keeping an ongoing balance sheet. In between elections, any funds remaining in the campaign account or funds raised during the term are deposited into a fixed deposit account.

RAISE THE DAM!

EXPLAINING THE GREAT WATER SUPPLY DEBATE ON THE GOLD COAST

There has been a lot of confusion in the community over the past year about the Gold Coast City Council raising the Hinze Dam wall for flood mitigation as opposed to raising the wall for water storage. It is clear from media articles and from feedback in the community that a clear understanding of the issues, arguments and options is needed. This newsletter will hopefully answer all your questions and set the record straight, once and for all.

My name is Ted Shepherd and as your council representative for Division 9, I have been leading the push within Council for the Hinze Dam wall and spillway raised for water storage. While I have 6 councillors supporting me, 7 councillors are currently opposed to raising the Hinze Dam for water storage purposes¹. I did however win a small but important battle in September of 2003, convincing my fellow councillors to **keep the option of raising the Hinze Dam to stage 3 on the water planning agenda**².

But the fight to win over the remaining councillors to raise the Dam to Stage 3 is not over yet. I am committed to seeing the Hinze Dam wall and spillway raised for both water storage and flood mitigation purposes, thus securing a water supply for the Gold Coast for decades to come while protecting the community from the effects of flood damage.

The biggest misconception is that raising the Hinze Dam for flood mitigation will also increase the water storage, however, this is simply not true. Another misconception is that the Council has not planned for or has any money saved to do anything about increasing the water supply for the city. The truth is that the city has over \$55 million dollars saved for building additional water storage facilities **today**.

In the end the city is suffering its worst drought on record³. This drought has shown us that we need to change forever the way we value water and I would like to thank the community for their tremendous water conservation efforts thus far.

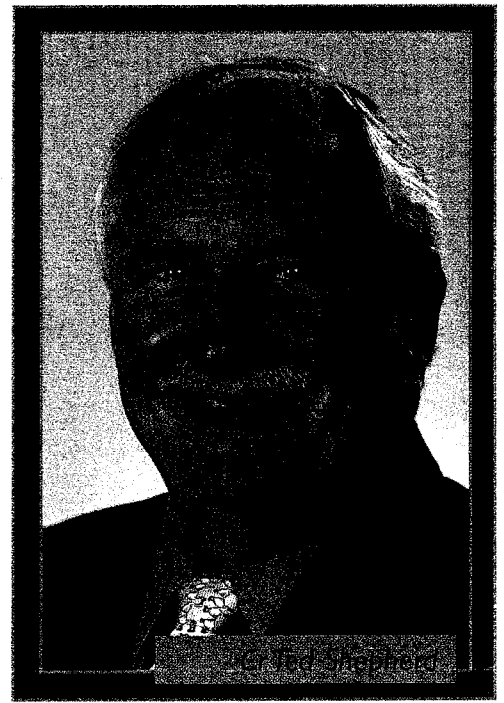

WHAT YOU CAN DO ABOUT IT...

As your local councillor I would like your support on Election Day to continue the fight to get the Hinze Dam wall raised by 16 metres to Stage 3 including spillway. ***My commitment to you is that I will continue to lead the push within Council to raise the Hinze Dam to Stage 3.***

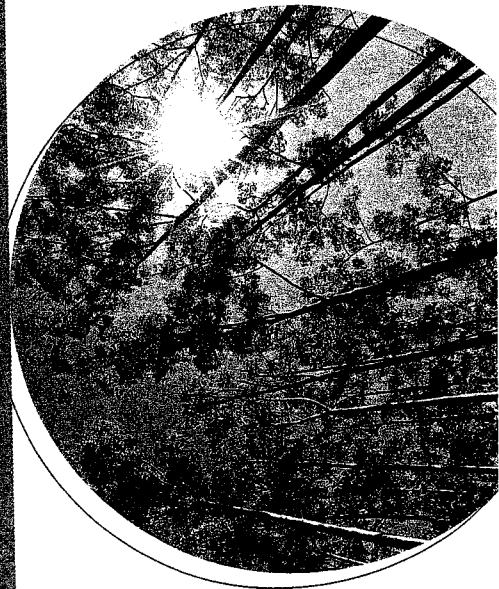

Open Space Land Acquisition



Councillor Ted Shepherd was primarily responsible for preserving some 1620 hectare in Division 9, or about **70% of the total open space acquired by the whole Gold Coast Council over the past 4 years**. 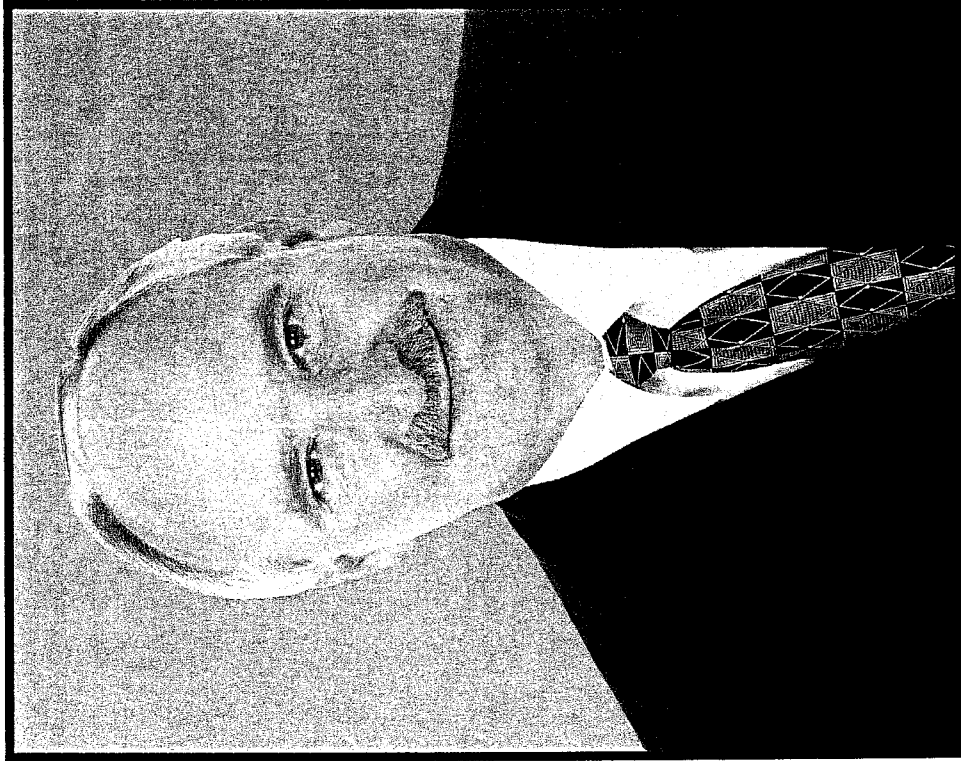

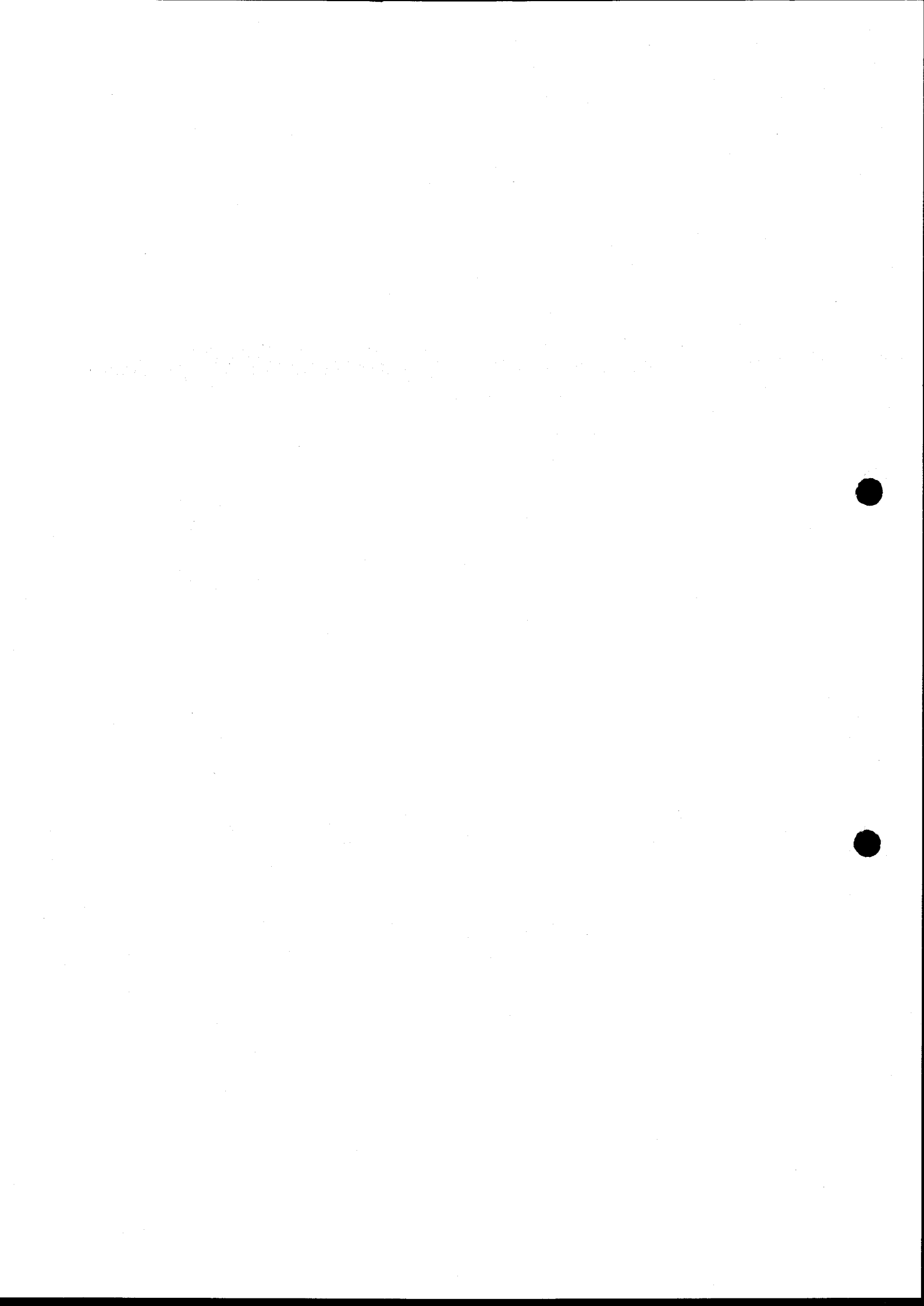

As you may be aware Council elections have now been called for the 27 March 2004 so I thought it appropriate to write to you to advise of changes that will affect your area.

Following a redistribution of boundaries the northern boundary of Division 9 will move from the centre of the Nerang River to the centre line of Alexander Drive. This means that your property remains in Division 9 and I would hope that with your support, I will continue as your Councillor for the coming term.

There are several issues that affect your area that I have been working diligently to try to resolve. The first is construction of additional carparking for the Worongary State School in Delta Cove Drive to alleviate traffic congestion and provide a much needed upgrade for parking facilities for this growing school.

Thanks for your emails. The latest Election Program features a "Leaflet - Water/Hinze Dam (A3) Printed" with 12,000 required for 19 January, then another "Water Leaflet" - For Distribution" another 12,000 required for 27 January. Could you clarify the purpose of the two please?

Going over the allocated budgets it is quite obvious that any involvement by Quadrant is now totally out of the question. Even at basic raw nett costs there is not a competent artist or printer that we employ or would recommend that can come close to these figures. For example 12,000 professionally produced, written and photographed full colour A3 single fold leaflets for \$2000 is simply not in my realm of my experience. All the nett cost competitive quotes we produced this week I have scrapped in the light of these figures.

I would strongly suggest that Wayne continue to produce design, write and organize printing of all material as in the past. This will also avoid the confusion over who, what and how and the start/stop work that was most evident this week. I'm happy to review the water material copy and give my comments which I will do over the weekend and pass back to you and Wayne for further action.

Although we had set up your Campaign as a completely separate account here at Quadrant it is obvious that you are quite concerned with a possible association with other candidates. The absence of any work through Quadrant should, I hope, eliminate this possibility although continued involvement on your campaign committee could possibly be equally compromising. We possibly need to discuss that aspect as well soon.

Back to shortly on the water issue.

HOW TO BE TOP NOTCH BOOTH CAPTAIN!!!

Why polling day is so important?

I am sure you will all agree that the first step in getting elected to council comes down to people recognising the candidate's name and face. **Doorknocking** is a big part of this effort, as is advertising and of course publicity in the media. With doorknocking it is hard to get to all the 16,000 to 18,000 people in the division. Advertising is expensive and the media usually only give good coverage to the sitting councillor. So it really comes down to *doorknocking* and *polling day*.

Despite all the efforts throughout the campaign around 25% of voters do not know who they are going to vote for as they approach the booth.

So what makes a good booth captain?

- You would have set your alarm so that you would arrive at 5:55am at the booth, ready to set up by 6:10am. **Possession is the key to get booth gate position.** Merely setting up and leaving to come back later will result in your position being lost and possibly our gear (signs etc...) being stolen. Des will be ringing you at 5:30am to ensure you are up and going!
- You would read the "How to be a TOP NOTCH booth worker" fact sheet and ensure that your booth workers follow it.
- You would keep an eye on all the possible voter entry routes and ensure we have them covered.
- You would introduce yourself to the presiding officer for the booth when they arrive at around 7:30am.
- You would stay around all day, getting relieved by the "Area Captain (either Todd or Wayne) at various times of the day.
- You would ensure that opposition workers were not hassling our workers or moving or removing our signage.
- You would report opposition booth workers soliciting voters immediately to the presiding officer.
- You would ensure that you were not tricked by imposters posing as your workers: you would check your worker names against the booth roster and ring the emergency list if there was any discrepancy.
- You would watch out for your booth workers being tricked by opposition workers trying to distract your workers from handing out how to vote cards.
- You would resist attempts by opposition booth workers from getting you into arguments.

PLEASE TURN OVER

P.T.O.

- You would not allow booth workers to go home early in their shift because you think your gate is “covered” enough as a lot of booth workers is a sign to voters that this candidate is well supported in the community also a rush of voters might appear.
- You would ensure that all workers are wearing the Bibs.
- You would use the camera as a way to encourage opposition booth workers from doing illegal disruptive acts to your workers.
- If there is any trouble or if you run out of any item at all you would call the emergency numbers listed on the inside of the booth box.
- On busy booths you would not let your booth workers sit down and still hand out how to votes.
- You would ring the booth workers number listed on the roster if they are at all late and then ring emergency numbers listed if a booth worker will be very late or can’t suddenly can’t make it.
- Your would ring the emergency numbers if you have a rush of voters and your team is overwhelmed.

Why polling day is so important?

I am sure you will all agree that the first step in getting elected to council comes down to people recognising the candidate's name and face. **Doorknocking** is a big part of this effort, as is advertising and of course publicity in the media. With doorknocking it is hard to get to all the 16,000 to 18,000 people in the division. Advertising is expensive and the media usually only give good coverage to the sitting councillor. So it really comes down to *doorknocking* and *polling day*.

Despite all the efforts throughout the campaign around 25% of voters do not know who they are going to vote for as they approach the booth.

So what makes a good booth worker?

- You would be neat and tidy in dress / appearance
- You would be wearing the "Vote 1 Ted Shepherd" vest.
- You would greet voters politely with a simple "Good Morning / Good Afternoon...":
SMILE ☺
- You would ensure that each voter gets at least one How to Vote card.
- You would not get into arguments with opposing candidate booth workers.
- **You would not solicit voters to vote a particular way because that is not allowed.**
- **You would talk very favourably about Ted when asked a question about the candidate by a voter – this is allowed.** If the question is electoral in nature you would direct them to the returning officer inside.
- **You could tell voters to make sure they only place a "1" next to Ted as a cross is an informal vote.**
- You would hold your "How to vote" cards facing the incoming voter as they give them a card. (ie: a bit like dealing cards from a face up pack!)
- You would try to be the **last** "how to vote card" given to the voter. This is usually achieved by being closest to the gate opening. Remember to be no closer than six meters from the booth entrance.
- You would not obstruct the gate or path ways so voters have a clear run.
- You would not leave until the replacement arrives (as they may be late) as leaving our how to vote cards or other material unattended invites the other side to steal them!
- You would call the emergency numbers listed on the inside of the booth box if there is any hint of trouble.

Please Turn Over

- No matter how tired you would be you would stand to great voters and give them the how to vote card. There is not much sitting around on the busy booths! (Nerang & Mudgeeraba)
- No matter how many booth workers are covering your booth you would still stay for your shift as a big part of polling day success is showing voters that Ted as a lot of supporters willing to be booth workers for him.
- You would keep a look out for where voters are coming from to make sure we have all entrances covered.
- If a voter is unsure of where they can vote or if they are on the role, send them inside to the Presiding Officer. Don't get tied up in lengthy discussions with the voters

What to do if people want to know more about Ted.

- Talk to the person and tell them what you know about Ted:
 - Ted the family man,
 - the Nerang small business owner,
 - the long time resident of the Division, at Tallai,
 - the CG Ambulance Committee President, major fund raiser
 - the Police Youth Citizens Club committee member
 - Former council watchdog association Gold Coast Civic Action president.
 - PRO-RESIDENT, NOT PRO-GREEN AND NOT PRO-DEVELOPMENT

Watch out for:

Be aware that opposition booth workers will try to distract you by:

- Getting you into trivial arguments over minor, political or philosophical issues.
- Walking up like they are a voter and engaging you in conversations like "Tell me more about Ted" (That's why we have many workers on the major booths as some genuine voters will do this)
- Walking up to you like they are also one of Ted's Campaign workers and distract you with all sorts of dumb questions like "how does this bib go on", "shouldn't we shift Ted's signs?"-Booth workers for your booth are listed in the booth box. Call the emergency numbers if you are at all unsure.
- Standing in front of Ted's signs
- Standing in front of you blocking you from the voters as they come in
- Knocking over our table, Ted's signs,
- Making false complaints to the presiding officer about you soliciting votes or blocking access to voters, too much signage etc...

Forewarned is forearmed! :- if there is any of this trouble then alert your booth captain or ring the numbers on the emergency phone list on the inside of the booth box.

As you may be aware Council elections have now been called for the 27 March 2004 so I thought it appropriate to write to you to advise of changes that will affect your area.

Following a redistribution of boundaries the northern boundary of Division 9 will move from the centre of the Nerang River to the centre line of Alexander Drive. This means that your property remains in Division 9 and I would hope that with your support, I will continue as your Councillor for the coming term.

There are several issues that affect your area that I have been working diligently to try to resolve. The first is construction of additional carparking for the Worongary State School in Delta Cove Drive to alleviate traffic congestion and provide a much needed upgrade for parking facilities for this growing school.

The second is to seek financial assistance from Council to allow the construction of a joint facility at the William Duncan State School for a school hall and community centre. CHANGED RECOMMENDATIONS: Item 1.

Nerang River Flood Mitigation

1. That Council adopt the construction of Hinze Dam Stage 3 to its full height as the next phase in Council's long-term flood plain management strategy as it applies to the Nerang River Catchment, for completion by 2014.
2. That the design of Hinze Dam Stage 3 include construction for water storage as proposed in the original design documentation and that provision be made for the inclusion of flood mitigation devices as part of this design.
3. That a report be presented at the earliest opportunity to advise on funding options utilising State Government subsidies and Headworks trust fund reserves.
4. That independent consultants be engaged to provide design specifications for the raising of the dam wall including access road design, a recommendation for the preferred type of spillway system and a full cost analysis of the project.

Initiatives for my Second Term...

- Continue to lead the debate to raise the Hinze Dam wall to full height of Stage 3 for water storage purposes. Establish a time frame for installation and cost effective way for funding its construction.
- Continue to administer sensible DCPs (development control plans) within my Hinterland regions to enhance and protect our natural assets whilst allowing controlled growth. Areas of particular attention are Springbrook, Numinbah and Austinville. Strive to achieve a planning goal of restricting Residential Development to only covering 20% of the total City Area.
- Continue to assess innovative ideas and encourage commercial and economic viability of the business communities within the Division. Areas for particular attention include
 - Numinbah Valley – Tourism, Agriculture & Accommodation.
 - Nerang (Station Street Precinct) – Follow through to create river image.
 - Mudgeeraba – Historical Village, Alfresco Dining, Arts & Crafts.
 - Springbrook – Re-create the interest in Nature based Tourism & Accommodation; Arts, Crafts & Cottage Industries.
- Continue to oversee sensible financial management of Australia's Sixth largest City. I will fight against Rate Capping which will only benefit 1% on properties in our Division. Rate capping means that residents on the minimum general rate will pay more to subsidise the owners of millionaires row at Mermaid Beach. I will continue to pursue a fairer system where high-rise unit owners in very valuable units are required to pay rates comparable to the value of their unit, not the minimum rate because their property valuation is divided amongst the number of units in the complex.
- Continue to search out properties in the Hinterland that are venerable for development and place them on Council's acquisition programme using the open space preservation levy funds. In the last four years, \$ 4 millions dollars has been used to purchase 2000 ha of ecologically significant Hinterland properties. Under Council's ownership and control these properties can be maintained for generations to come. Division 9 has a substantial 'green' backdrop that needs to be saved and well managed.

- Continue to develop sporting fields and facilities for health and well-being of our youth. Firth Park at Mudgeeraba is finally being resolved after ten years of inaction with the building and football field lights due for completion in the first half of 2004. Additional facilities for softball, hockey, tennis and netball are being planned plus an expansion of the existing soccer fields to cater for massive growth in this sport. I believe it is time to introduce a specific area for BMX bicycle riders and an expansion of the skateboard facility on Somerset Drive is warranted. I also plan to construct a purpose-built bandshell in support of the volunteer bands and choirs which are becoming major attractions in the division. Firth Park is truly a regional sporting field which can be accessed by all sports men and women throughout the Gold Coast.
- Continue to push for additional funds above the divisional allocation to achieve upgrades for our roads and pathways. Now that work has commenced to upgrade Gilston Road at Nerang, it is imperative that this work continue all the way through to Hinde Road at Gilston. Many major Council roads need upgrades to meet current road standards (roads like Bonogin Road, Hinze Dam Road, Latimers Crossing Road, Somerset Drive, Hardys Road, Carrington Road, Smith Road) and it requires a strong and respected voice in Council to achieve the additional funding in the capital works programmes to include these projects. I will not accept that because we live in the foothills and western areas of the City, we have to be content with substandard roads or denied basic facilities like concrete kerbing and stormwater control. I will continue to fight for bitumen sealing of our gravel roads, kerb and channel where needed and stormwater drainage systems in roads and parks.
- Continue to work with the State Government to achieve recognition for service upgrades in our area. Major roadworks on Worongary Road and upgrading of the motorway overpasses at Highland Park, Mudgeeraba and Robina are essential to ensure that residents can move about the area in safety. It is extremely important that the State Government recognise the necessity of these projects as Council in partnership with the Government, is progressing with Council road upgrades and approving residential developments in compliance with the Strategic Plan. The Government must fulfil its obligations under this plan as well.

Water Storage - Issues and Arguments:

Decision to get 35 mgl from Logan (Council decision 13 December 2002)

Decision to get 85 mgl from Wivenhoe (Council decision 19 September 2003)

During Water debate I foreshadowed arguments for Stage 3 to stay on agenda.
13 December 2002; 9 May 2003; 19 September 2003.

Previous decision dates – Stage 1 built 1975, Stage 2 built 1988, Stage 3 scheduled for 2035.

The Glendower Dam was proposed to be built by 2012/13 as an interim supply but due to a re-calculation of its yield, it is unlikely that the Government will allow its construction.

Was this based on Strategic Plan and Population growth – 1.2million by 2050

Construction of 3 stages based on catchment yield from rainfall records – 1930 to 1983

2003 revised catchment yields based on computer predictions using ‘Historical Simulation Methodology’ – 1889 to 2002.

It predicts a reduced catchment yield from 350ML/day to 238ML/day.

* Dam has been built 14 years – has overtopped 12 times.

* Explain type of spillway currently in use – 2 tiers at different heights.

* Explain proposed flood mitigation process – flood gates on existing dam.

Show sketch of proposal – 4m wall extension plus flood gates.

Show sketch of stage 3 wall raising – side view of new wall.

Show comparison of water heights – Stage 3 doubles water storage capacity.

Compare costs – Flood mitigation (4m-Stage 2A) \$27 million,
Water Storage (16m-Stage 3) \$80 million.

Explain theory based on new catchment yield figures, how Stage 3 not only allows water storage, but has inherent flood mitigation benefits.

Explain time frames to obtain Government approvals and build.

Explain Funding? – ten years of planning time allows ratepayers to contribute towards a specific fund for the Dam construction; currently over \$30 million in trust accounts from development contributions for water supply Capital Works; as population grows the contribution pool increases which lessens the burden city-wide.

Flood Mitigation Only – Arguments Against.

Does not consider other River systems and the impact this has on residents in those areas. Committee was formed to check the reliability of the Mike 21 flood modelling and impacts that arose as speculation during the Merrimac Flood Plain committee reports.

Council Decision to implement Advisory Committee: 2 November 2001

Define the area of assessment undertaken by the Nerang River Flood Committee shows that impacts on flooding by tidal influence, Broadwater saltation or flooding in the Coomera, Pimpama, Albert and Logan Rivers; were not considered.

Committee recommendation called on the City to draw from the Hinze Dam first for general water supply to provide for additional 'free air space' storage capacity in the event of a major storm event to enhance the flood prevention down-stream. This means we sacrifice the City's water supply for the sake of reducing a 1 in 100 year flood impact. – totally illogical. Refer to recommendations as adopted 19 September 2003.

AN INFORMATIVE RESPONSE TO ALICE IN WONDERLAND

As the democratically elected representative for Division 9 and Councillor for the whole of the Gold Coast, I write to inform and educate an obviously unformed and community unaware Bulletin council reporter, Alice Jones. Her personal attack of 28 February 2004 GC Bulletin on my intent and qualifications in relation to my stance on building a larger Hinze Dam ignores the most important qualification of all when pursuing the best option for the Gold Coast water supply; I'm elected to represent the best interests of my constituents and she's not!

If it was up to Ms Jones, we would blindly follow the recommendations of council officers and smile and bear the brunt of their decision-making. Look how successful that ideology is Ms Jones when you next negotiate the traffic nightmare in Surfers Paradise that is a connivance of council officers providing half the solution.

I am supportive of incorporating as much flood mitigation as possible in any dam construction and this can be achieved within Hinze Dam 3. These solutions have been discussed with council officers since the days of the Albert Shire/Gold Coast City amalgamation so I am not putting any new engineering solutions forward for debate. I am merely putting forward a solution that is pragmatic entailing simple logic and best represents the wishes of the majority of the community that I represent

Raising the dam for flood mitigation only does not provide any additional water storage.

Alice Jones made play on the issue that my best credentials to make comment on this matter was my ownership of a very profitable little fish and chip shop at Nerang. In her deprecating sarcasm, she forgot to mention that I also had ten years in the design section of the Gold Coast City council engineering department and an additional seven years as council's technical supervisor of traffic engineering.

• Transport Plan to link Nerang to Mudgeeraba.

With the demise of the 'Hinterlink' bus service, the State Government is now pursuing a new concept called "Translink" where public transport customers buy one ticket only and it is usable on all public transport systems. The State Government will then collect all revenue and pay back to the bus companies a total cost subsidy on any bus route that they operate. The proposal that Council is now investigating is one where Council becomes involved in the process and helps to subsidise bus routes in areas where one does not currently exist and the new proposal would provide a bus service connecting Mudgeeraba to Nerang. This service would follow Worongary Road and Gilston Road with the route terminating at the railway stations of Robina and Nerang incorporating a bus interchange established in one of the major shopping centres off Gilston Road. Additionally, the bus routes through Nerang could be altered to not only service the Shopping Centres and Station Street but also loop through the centre of Nerang to service the new Nerang library and cinema complex. This type of connection between the communities of Mudgeeraba and Nerang has been an issue that I have pursued for many years and it finally seems to be coming to fruition. However, I need your feedback and opinions. Would you support this service and does it fulfil the need for public transport in the area? Please call my office or write to me, as I am sure this matter will be discussed during Council's budget discussions in May.

• William Duncan School Hall – Highland Park.

The Nerang/Highland Park community has identified that there is a growing need for a Community Hall in the Highland Park area. As mentioned in previous editions of the Local Newsletter, I have been working with the William Duncan State School to help put forward their proposal for construction of a combined School Hall and Community Centre. The closest facility to this area is at Bert Swift Park or Council's Bi-Centennial Centre and with the growing population around Highland Park this is just not good enough. The State Government has made a commitment of \$450,000 towards this project and it is now up to Council and local businesses to get behind the School's P&C committee to raise the balance of funds in this \$1.2 million project.

This shared facility has my full support and I have already been successful in getting \$150,000 allocated in Council's budget, but I need to convince my colleagues of the value that this community hall will bring to the local community. It is important that you write to me to identify all the possible uses that this building may cater for. I need to know all of the community groups, sporting groups, child-care, social groups and community get-togethers that would utilise this facility and how frequently. With collation of all of this information and combined with the joint use between William Duncan School and Worongary School, I am confident we can convince Council to allocate additional funding. I thank you for your help on this issue and congratulate the School's P&C for their determination and wonderfully successful fundraising activities.

• Bonogin/Mudgeeraba/Nerang - Television Receptions.

With the ongoing support of our Federal Member, Mrs Margaret May, Council officers and I have continued to negotiate the improvement to television receptions for hinterland residents. The conversion to Digital transmission is a significant step forward and will provide a strong clear television signal to areas that would previously receive poor or even no reception. The conversion of facilities on Tamborine Mountain should occur in August/September of this year and Springbrook would be brought on line at that time. The reason for the delay is that the tower at Tamborine was found to be too small to support the new dish antennae and all the steelwork needs to be upgraded. Technicians have identified that the existing tower on Springbrook is satisfactory for their needs and I have recommended that to reduce delays to solving black spot problems, the transmission antennae be installed at Springbrook at the same time as Tamborine is being upgraded. The Federal Minister has confirmed that the project will proceed and that funding is in place for this to occur. Additionally, all Commercial television stations are now transmitting a digital signal from Brisbane and they are reporting substantial improvements in 'black spot' receptions. Our residents have been very patient in waiting for this upgrade in television service and deserve better, and even though this is purely a Federal Government initiative, I will continue to pressure the powers-that-be to ensure that this work is completed.

• Council Election - 2004.

By the time you receive this newsletter, the State Elections would have been held and attention turns to the City Council elections. Nominations for the positions of Councillors and Mayor will be called on February 11 and will close on February 27 with the election one month later on March 27. I have already declared that I will be seeking re-election to continue the positive works that have lifted Division 9 to become a wholesome and safe place to live and work. I have been required to make some hard decisions but at all times I have had your best interests at heart. If my decisions have not matched your expectations, I apologise, but as people will tell you, it is always better to make a decision and get things done than never make a decision and offend no-one. With your support and assistance, I look forward to the challenges and achievements of my next term in Council.

Raise the Dam!

Explaining the great water supply debate on the Gold Coast...

There's been a lot of confusion in the community over the past year about the Gold Coast City Council raising the Hinze Dam wall for **flood mitigation** as opposed to raising the wall for **water storage**. It is clear from media articles and from feedback in the community that a clear understanding of the issues, arguments and options is needed. □

Raising the Hinze Dam for flood mitigation **does not add a single drop of water** to the city's water storage capacity. Only by raising the Hinze Dam wall 16 metres to the *full height of Stage 3* will the water storage in the Hinze Dam be increased, in fact doubling its current capacity. Stage 3 will also provide **flood protection** for the Nerang river system through its greater storage and slow release tiered spillway. Raising the Dam for *flood mitigation only* simply allows for the introduction of floodgates to hold back the water. The spillway remains at its current height. It adds nothing to the water storage capacity. □

The State Government's Department of Natural Resources says the Dam catchment rainfall isn't good enough to fill the dam, however, I disagree and point to the fact that Hinze Dam has **over flowed the spillway 12 times in the past 14 years**, with the water wasted down the Nerang River. □

As your representative in Council I have been *leading the fight* within Council to get the **Hinze Dam wall and spillway raised**. While I have 6 councillors supporting me, 8 councillors are currently opposed to raising the Hinze Dam for water storage purposes. However I did win a small but important concession in September of 2003, convincing my fellow councillors to **keep the option of raising the Hinze Dam** on the water planning agenda. But the fight to win over the remaining councillors to raise the Dam to Stage 3 is not over yet.

Another misconception is that the Council has not planned for nor has money left over to do anything about increasing the water supply for the City. The truth is that the City has over **\$30 million dollars already saved** for building additional water supply capacity. I have also recently discovered a little known State Government *subsidy scheme* which is able to fund 40% of the cost of raising the Hinze Dam for water supply purposes. The subsidy for flood mitigation is only 20% and the scheme runs out in June 2006.

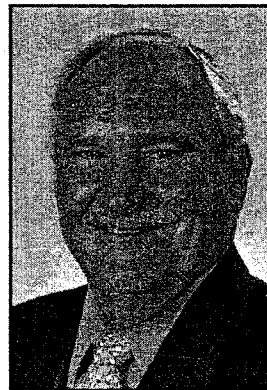
During my first term Council has funded and completed construction (early 2003) of a **35 megalitre per day pipe** to draw extra water from Wivenhoe via Logan City and has more recently approved the funding and construction of an additional **85 megalitre Wivenhoe water access pipe**, a project which is currently underway. □

As your local Councillor I would *like your support* on Election Day to continue the fight to get the **Hinze Dam wall raised by 16 metres to Stage 3 including the spillway**. My commitment to you is that I will continue to **lead the fight within Council** to make raising the Hinze Dam, doubling the Hinze Dam water storage capacity and its resultant flood mitigation potential for the city, a reality. □

• **Clover Hill Reservoirs – The Facts.**

Following the outcry from residents concerning the large scar on the side of the hill at Somerset, I successfully raised in Council that a full report be presented to explain why this work was needed and what action will be taken to rectify the destruction of the tree-line. As this area is currently within Division 12, Councillor Drake has made a public statement about the outcomes but I thought it would be appropriate for me to respond to you as well. The works are necessary to allow Gold Coast Water to construct two very large water reservoirs to service the needs of the surrounding communities of Mudgeeraba, Reedy Creek and Robina. The work has been planned for four years and was listed in the capital works programme two years ago. The report details substantial landscaping works to revegetate the site and you may already notice that the cliff face has been terraced and planted. In a short time, plants will grow over the cliff face to return the view lines of the ridgetop and hillside. The reservoirs themselves will be painted a neutral colour to blend with the backdrop and the area around the base of the reservoirs will be landscaped. Although an ugly scar at the moment, I have noted the guarantees of our Council Officers that every effort will be made to re-habilitate this site.

• **Proposed New Rating Systems.**

An issue, which has just started to reach a level of 'heated debate', is the call by some Councillors for a change to the way that Council currently assess your annual rate charge. They propose to introduce Capping, Banding or Averaging of the rate assessment amount based on the unimproved capital value of your property. No matter how they slice it or what they call it, in essence any of these new systems will only favour those property owners at the top end of the scale and disadvantage property owners with lower property values. The committee that was formed to review the rating systems was sidetracked by Political motivation and regrettably made recommendations that were radically new but impractical to implement. Put simply, they propose that 69% of the city pay an extra \$20 so that the top end pays less. They propose raising the minimum rate from \$503 to \$523 and this means that everybody in my Division, including pensioners and low-income earners will pay more to subsidise beachfront properties. I WILL NOT support this and WILL NOT stand by and let this happen... What we can do however is to balance the accounts with high-rise unit owners. As a unit building is contained on one allotment, the unimproved capital value (UCV) is split between all of the unit owners. This means that all unit owners, even those in million dollar apartments, are only required to pay the current minimum general rate. This is not fair and equitable. I have asked for a review of the rating system to ensure that everybody pays his or her fair share. Like any tax collection system, the current rate calculation process is not to everybody's liking but it is the best we have and does work. Let's refine the process and make the current system fairer and ensure that all property owners pay their fair share.

• **Public Transport Nerang to Mudgeeraba.**

Following my call for feedback about the provision of a bus service connecting Nerang to Mudgeeraba, the number of people who have indicated that they would use a bus service should one be provided has surprised me. The proposal called for a service to connect the railway stations at Nerang and Robina by using the backroads along Gilston, Worongary and Mudgeeraba Roads. This service would also connect into the major shopping centre precincts at Nerang as well as the Nerang Cinema and Council's new library. I will continue to follow this proposal and report back to you in greater detail when the proposal is better defined.

• **Council Election - Pre-Polling booths.**

In Queensland, voting is compulsory and if you are enrolled on the State and Federal Electoral Rolls, you are automatically included on the Local Government roll. On voting day, Saturday 27th March, the polling places open between 8.00am and 6.00pm so there is plenty of time to lodge your vote. However, if you are unavailable on polling day for any good reason, there is an alternative. Pre-polling booths will be established at most Council offices throughout the City but the main location for our division will be at the Nerang Council Administration centre. Pre-polling is available between 9.00am and 4.30pm on weekdays from the 15th March through to 26th March. It is easy and it is convenient and if I can assist in any way please call my contact number.

• **Surfers Paradise Traffic Problems.**

Recent debate has centred on the call by Surfers Paradise businessmen for Councillors to make a commitment to completing Stages 2 and 3 of the road upgrades. This work expands on the Stage 1 work that diverts all major traffic onto a four lane Ferny Avenue and provides a slow moving traffic system through the town centre. They are asking Council to borrow \$24 million to undertake this work but Council officers have raised concerns with me that this scheme will not solve any Traffic problems. They are certain that it will simply expand the area that is affected but we will still have the same traffic volumes and still have the same congestion points. For example, to get to Chevron Island, motorists will still need to leave the main traffic stream and use the old Gold Coast Highway. The disturbing thing is the funding requirements. \$24 million can only be provided by raising rates to pay off a long-term loan or remove other big works items out of our capital works programme. I cannot support either of these options and will continue to argue against this scheme until an alternative is suggested.

Shepherd urges Councillors to give a dam..

Councilor for Division 9, Ted Shepherd, is calling on his fellow Gold Coast City Councilors to support his proposal to give the green light to the third and final stage of the Hinze Dam project, effectively doubling the dam's water storage capacity.

The \$80million Shepherd proposal will raise the dam wall by 16m and protect the Gold Coast against future droughts and floods.

"If Councilors give a dam about the future of the Gold Coast, they now have the opportunity to do something about it and protect residents from future water restrictions," Councilor Shepherd said.

Cr Shepherd said the much-needed proposal would draw on funds already put aside by Council for the improvement of water supply, and from a State Government subsidy scheme for Local Councils.

"The Council has considerable amount of money sitting idle, waiting to be used for this very purpose. Money in the bank won't put water through our taps," Cr Shepherd said.

The Shepherd proposal would fastrack stage three of the Hinze Dam project from completion in 2035 to 2015, giving residents and tourist operators the reassurance that the city is safe from water shortage and flood mitigation.

"My proposal is the only logical option for the Council and the only proposal that serves to substantially increase water supplies and protect the coast against floods," Cr Shepherd said.

Cr Shepherd is urging all Councilors at today's Coordination Committee meeting to support the only proposal that will double the storage capacity of the dam – the Shepherd proposal.
