A piece of history was enacted on Saturday 8th November when the moderate environmental organization Communities for Sustainable Futures (CSF) resolved unanimously to give favourable consideration to Chambers of Commerce joining their organization.

This has the potential of being the first step in achieving a long sought after balance in environmental protection allowing responsible growth in business, community and infrastructure.


